A \$36,000 grant from the CLA Foundation through Clifton, Larson, Allen's Community Action Fund enables more than 250 chronically-absent middle schoolers to connect daily with AmeriCorps mentors through Attendance Matters®.

A \$5,000 grant from BMO Bank N.A. will be utilized to enhance student success and encourage a positive path towards graduation through our Attendance Matters® mentorship program in 9 local middle schools.
